



## **Primary School Sports Premium**

### **What is Sports Premium?**

The Government is providing additional funding to provide substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils progress and participation in PE and school sport.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that the school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

You should not use your funding to:

- employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets
- teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum)

### **How will we be spending the Sports Premium Funding and who will benefit?**

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunities to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; swimming is subsidised in order to support all families financially.
